Paying Tribute to Women in the Military

When Wilma Vaught joined the military in 1950s, there were strong restrictions on the number of women in the military and the capacity in which they could serve. Vaught broke her fair share of glass ceilings. She was the first woman to deploy with an Air Force bomber wing. She was promoted to brigadier general in 1980, and when she retired five years later, she was one of only seven female generals or admirals in all the armed forces.

Following her retirement as a brigadier general, she became concerned that the role of women in the military was going unnoticed. Wilma Vaught was the driving force that built the \$22.5 million Women's Memorial at the gateway to Arlington National Cemetery. She is now the President of the Women in Military Service for America Memorial Foundation. The Memorial and its 33,000 square feet education facility is the nation's only major memorial to pay tribute to America's 2.5 million women who have served. The Memorial stands as a place where America's servicewomen can take their rightful place in history and where their stories will be told for future generations. Because of Wilma Vaught, the American people and visitors from around the world can learn of the courage and bravery of tens of thousands of American women who, like her, have pioneered the future.

This legislative package includes:

- The Healthy Working Families Act (earned paid sick days). Over 700,000 workers in our state are unable to earn any paid sick days.
- More fair scheduling practices so that parents can plan adequately for childcare, school, or a second job.
- End to UNEQUAL PAY for women.

An Amazon Best Book of July 2015: Readers of his work in The Atlantic and elsewhere know Ta-Nehisi Coates for his thoughtful and influential writing on race in America. Written as a series of letters to his teenaged son, his new memoir, Between the World and Me, walks us through the course of his life, from the tough neighborhoods of Baltimore in his youth, to Howard University—which Coates dubs "The Mecca" for its revelatory community of black students and teachers—to the broader Meccas of New York and Paris. Coates describes his observations and the evolution of his thinking on race, from Malcolm X to his conclusion that race itself is a fabrication, elemental to the concept of American (white) exceptionalism. Ferguson, Trayvon Martin, and South Carolina are not bumps on the road of progress and harmony, but the results of a systemized, ubiquitous threat to "black bodies" in the form of slavery, police brutality, and mass incarceration. Coates is direct and, as usual, uncommonly insightful and original. There are no wasted words. This is a powerful and exceptional book.--Jon Foro
