# Facts and Falsehoods about Islam and Muslims: A Woman's Perspective

# Dr. Sahar Khamis, University of Maryland, College Park



Many of us have preconceived ideas about what it means to be Muslim – and particularly, what it means to be a Muslim woman. Dr. Sahar Khamis will share with us the facts and falsehoods about our impressions – and will particularly focus on issues of women in the culture, differentiating from being Muslim and being Arab. She will also share perspectives on how Islamic extremists may be interpreted within Islam and the Koran.

Dr. Sahar Khamis is an Associate Professor of Communication at the University of Maryland; an expert on Arab and Muslim media; an ethnographer; an Islamic feminist; a peace activist; an interfaith advocate; a media commentator; a radio host; and a human rights' commissioner. She is the author of two books and many scholarly papers, written in both English and Arabic, and has received a number of prestigious academic and professional awards. She was formerly Head of the Mass Communication and Information Science Department in Qatar University, and holds a Ph.D. in Mass Media and Cultural Studies from the University of Manchester in England.

I'm proud that AAUW – both at the state and national level – is working with our elected officials to advocate for women's involvement in politics, in education and in their work lives. I'm pleased that AAUW accomplished so much, including these important items on a national level:



**Preparing for Election Day 2016.** *It's My Vote: I Will Be Heard* campaign is a critical effort to register women voters, get them to the polls, and make sure that all women's voices are heard this November. We're also looking toward future elections by investing in our Elect Her program, which is the only initiative in the country that encourages, trains, and empowers college women to run for student government and future elected office.

Awarding more than \$3.7 million in fellowships and grants to outstanding women nationwide for the 2015-16 academic year. This money gives women the

opportunity to pursue their dreams and break through barriers for all women around the world.

**Providing groundbreaking research.** AAUW's newest research report, *Barriers and Bias: The Status of Women in Leadership*, explores the obstacles that hold women back from reaching their full leadership potential. Despite making up approximately 50 percent of the U.S. workforce, women are shockingly outnumbered in leadership positions in the education, corporate, and political sectors. This report provides practical recommendations for moving more women up into seats of power.

**Making important progress toward closing the gender wage gap.** Through AAUW Work Smart in Boston alone, 85,000 women will be trained through our salary negotiation workshops by 2020. With your support, this program can expand to reach thousands more women across the country.


