Dr. Edwards is the managing editor of the Wharton Healthcare Quarterly and the author of Be Less Stressed and a McGraw-Hill GI text. She is a member of the board of two nonprofits, Bread for the City and T1D Exchange, and an Advisor to Keen.

She received her BA from Harvard University, her MD from the Perelman School of Medicine at the University of Pennsylvania, and her MBA from the Wharton School. She completed her GI fellowship at UCSF, San Francisco.

- May 14 Maryland Primary Election (Early voting May 2 through May 9 in the county where you live.) Registered voters have always been able to vote during early voting, but now individuals who are eligible but not yet registered can register and vote. To register and vote during early voting, go to an early voting center in the county where you live and bring a document that proves where you live. This document can be your MVA-issued license, ID card, or change of address card, or your paycheck, bank statement, utility bill, or other government document with your name and new address. Membership Update It Can Be Confusing!

As we move through the upcoming program year, you'll obviously want to renew your membership at some point. Currently, depending on when you initially joined AAUW, your membership renewal date may vary from a fellow member. If you initially joined AAUW before February 2022, your membership runs from June 30th of one year to June 29th of the following year. However, if you joined after that date, your membership runs for an entire year from that point in time. So, if you joined April 1st, your membership is good until March 31st of the following year.

Confused? Don't worry. National headquarters at AAUW sends out a reminder to each member about 2 weeks before their membership expires. However, sometimes this may go to your spam or junk mail by accident, so please check those mailboxes as well.

The website may be confusing to some. If you would prefer to send a check to our treasurer Karen Braun with your renewal, that is fine. The total for national, state and branch membership is currently \$98 per year. We have included a membership/ membership renewal form later in this newsletter, and you can use that instead.

Christine Schmitz, our AAUW Maryland Treasurer, also reminds us that if you are not sure if you have renewed your dues, you can look up your membership on the National website at http://www.aauw.org. Just log in and scroll down to the "Join On" and "Member Thru" dates at the bottom of your Personal Snapshot page. Of course, the "Member Thru" date will also tell you when to start keeping a look-out for the renewal email mentioned above. President's Letter AAUW Vote: My Humble Opinion

Dear AAUW Friends.

As you know, currently anyone holding an associate degree or equivalent or a bachelor's or higher degree may join AAUW. Recently, a proposal to change the AAUW bylaws was made that would give those who may not hold these advanced degrees the opportunity to join AAUW. AAUW sent ballots on this proposal to all of its members with the original email coming from AAWU with the subject title, *AAUW Election 2024* on or about April 3, 2024. Fortunately, AAUW is sending out the ballot again in early May for voting yes or no on this proposal. Voting ends May 15th.

I am including this in my President's Note because I have strong personal opinions on this issue. This represents my opinion only, not that of this branch, state organization or AAUW national. Good people disagree on the best choice.

I believe that we have sufficiently broadened our membership criteria and need to have educational criteria to differentiate our organization from other women's groups. I feel

that our history and the fact that we not only advocate for education for women but demonstrate that commitment by our own educational achievements strengthens our



voice when advocating for issues we care about or those we are seeking through court action. As a long-time marketing professor and consultant, I believe we need to figure out what makes us different – and the one constant is our emphasis on education. We have already changed requirements so that those who have a 2-year degree - or an equivalent educational attainment – are eligible for membership. Indeed, in our own branch, we have members who joined us under these guidelines.

Our national AAUW Board feels that removing the educational requirement would make us more

appealing to corporate donors. I disagree. First, we are a membership organization, not a donor organization, and our first duty is to our members. Second, corporate donors are able to fund initiatives that they are interested in without regard to our educational requirements. I see no change in their attitudes based on our educational requirements. They also feel that this would increase our membership, but we already include in our "count" those who are supporters, and membership is not requirement for that classification. And finally, we have a long history of advocating for and supporting higher education for women – and we demonstrate that commitment by our own choices. We have earned the right to be a part of this important and effective organization – AAUW.

You may disagree – and whether you agree or disagree with me, I hope you will vote on this issue to assess the will of our members. Obviously, we will abide by the results of the vote. Indeed, we have voted on this issue at least twice in recent years – and each time it has failed.

Here's how you can help:

- Keep a watchful eye for your ballot from AAUW with the subject title, AAUW
 Election 2024, and enter your vote.
- If you do not receive a ballot to your email account, please check your spam folder.
- In the past, adding vote@simplyvoting.com to your contact list has helped to channel the ballot to your email address instead of your spam folder.
